- Your manuscript must have between 4000 and 8000 words
- All papers should be sent electronically to [vdenhere@uj.ac.za](mailto:vdenhere@uj.ac.za)
- Apply the Harvard method of referencing
- Use 2.54 cm or 1" margins
- Use only 11 pt Times New Roman font
- Paper size must be set to A4
- Spelling must be set to English UK
- Line spacing should be 1½
- The justification should be set to full
- All pages should be numbered
